MP Rajeev in a war of letters with Ratan Tata



WITH his open letter to Tata Group Chairman Ratan Tata, Rajya Sabha MP and former telecommunications entrepreneur Rajeev Chandrasekhar has added another twist to the 2G scam. Chandrasekhar has alleged that while the latter had called for a probe into the scam, his group company Tata Tele was its biggest beneficiary. Chandrasekhar said he wanted to draw Mr Tata's attention to "the contradictions between your stand and the position of the Tata Telecom companies, that you may be unaware of, given your senior position in your organisation." Chandrasekhar founded BPL Mobile, which became the largest cellular operator in India in 2001. He now runs Jupiter Capital founded in 2005 with an aim of foraying into Greenfield businesses. He has in turn been accused by Tata of being motivated by his "affiliation to a particular political party", read BJP. With Tata hardly being one to back down from a fight, the comeback from Chandrasekhar is another thickening plot in the 2G scam saga.
